This unique weekly syndicated column is written by an American who has lived in Washington since 1975. Mark Bruzonsky has exceptional experience throughout the Middle East, including in Israel and well as most Arab countries, over the past two decades. He has advanced professional degrees in International Affairs from Princeton University (MIA - Masters in International Affairs) and from New York University School of Law (J.D. -- Juris Doctor). He has made more than 150 trips to the Middle East region since 1972. And he has unique experience working with both Jews and Arabs for the past 15 years -- currently as Chairman of The Jewish Committee on the Middle East and previously having represented the World Jewish Congress in Washington until 1984.

Beginning last January the weekly "From Washington" column is supplemented each month either with an exclusive interview or a special investigative report. The interviews so far this year have been with Professor Noam Chomsky, world famous linguist and political commentator; President Kurt Waldheim, President of Austria; and Former General Matti Peled, leading Israeli peace activist and former member of the Israeli Army General Staff. The first special investigative report has been about the plans by more than one thousand Israeli peace activists to "march" to Cairo to defy their government and meet with the PLO.

Mark Bruzonsky holds a dual degree in international affairs from Princeton University and in law from New York University. He attended the Woodrow Wilson School at Princeton attaining a Masters in International Affairs (M.I.A.); and then completed his law studies as a Root-Tilden Scholar and received his Juris Doctor (J.D.). During his graduate school years Bruzonsky also served as Chief Representative to the United Nations of the International Student Movement for the United Nations (ISMUN) traveling to 35 countries. Prior to his graduate study Bruzonsky received his B.A. cum laude in government and economics from Lawrence University in Wisconsin, nicknamed "the Harvard of the Midwest".

For eight years Bruzonsky was Associate Editor of Worldview Magazine in New York and for two years Forum Editor of The Middle East Magazine published in London. From 1977 through 1984 he was Washington Associate of The World Jewish Congress when that organization was headed by Nahum Goldmann and Philip Klutznick. He has been a consultant on Middle East affairs in Washington for Congressional Quarterly, the National Geographic Society, and the Smithsonian's Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars which in 1987 published his latest edited book, Security in the Middle East: Regional Change and Great Power Strategies. Bruzonsky's articles and interviews have appeared in numerous publications in the U.S., Europe, Israel, and the Middle East.

Bruzonsky is also founder and Chairman of The Jewish Committee on the Middle East, an organization which includes Jewish professors at over 135 universities and that has recognized the Palestinian State declared by the Palestine National Council and is calling for a major reduction of U.S. aid to Israel. And he is co-publisher of the new international English magazine, Semite International.
